Muiracatiara or Tigerwood is a Central and South American wood. The striking feature of this type of wood is the striped pattern that makes the wood unmistakable, which is why it is also known as tigerwood or zebrawood. The colouring is orange-brown with black veins, the sapwood is grey-yellowish. The existing pores of the Muiracatiara are small and distributed, the alternating grain shows with a fine texture.
