Description

The American white oak has a darker and denser wood than the red oak. The grain is often irregular and cross-grained. In addition, beautiful veining gives the light yellow to medium or dark brown coloured wood a decorative touch. This decorative note is underlined by the large, broad wood rays, which can be recognised as lively mirrors or spindles.

In contrast to red oak, latewood vessels are very small, grouped and thin-walled. The sapwood is light, the heartwood is light to dark brown.
